

Parking Enforcement Officers routinely patrol schools to enforce parking regulations. Parents should park safely at schools and obey

No Parking and No Stopping signs. Leave bus stops for buses, and fire routes for emergency vehicles.

Tips for drivers

- Don't park unless it's absolutely necessary and leave once your child is on school property so other parents are able to drop off their children.
- · Park legally to ensure the safety of others.
- Remember the rules of the road. Don't speed, block lanes of traffic, double park, block driveways, or use the drop off zones as a parking lot. It's easy to make mistakes when you're in a rush, but these actions put students at risk.
- Park away from the school and walk with your child to and from their designated entrance.
- Take turns with other parents and share the driving. It will help lessen the congestion and make it safer for everyone.
- Consider walking to school or letting your child walk with a group of other kids.

No Stopping signs



In school zones, the **No Stopping** sign indicates that there is no stopping at any time, or during the times posted.

No stopping means you cannot stop, even momentarily, to pick up or drop off passengers, otherwise your vehicle may be ticketed.

No Parking signs



Drivers are allowed to stop in **No Parking** zones while picking up or dropping off passengers. Do not leave your vehicle unattended. Vehicles left unattended may be ticketed.

Drivers must obey the **No Parking** or **No Stopping** signs. These areas are usually located on either side of the street near schools and must be clear to provide visibility for motorists and students.
